




#### STUDENTS AND THEIR EXPERIENCE: A COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS

One of the best ways of learning is to compare different things. The following two projects – "Student Experience in the Research University" (SERU-I) and "Student Trajectories and Experience at Russian Universities" – analyze the experiences of undergraduate and specialist level students in leading univer-sities in the USA, China and Russia. All students were able to answer the same questions, thus, allowing us to compare HSE students with those of 20 universities in the USA, three universities in China, and 11 universities in Russia.










#### COUNTRIES WHERE HSE ALUMNI CONTINUE THEIR STUDIES
